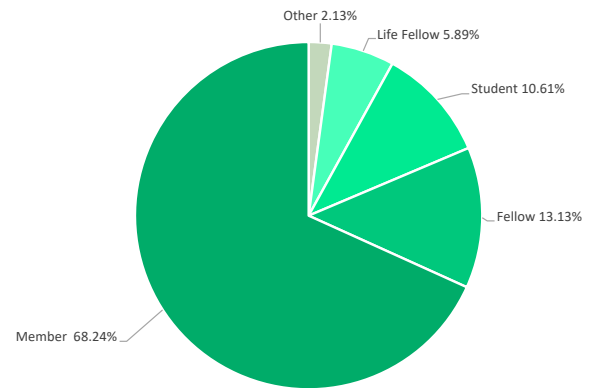

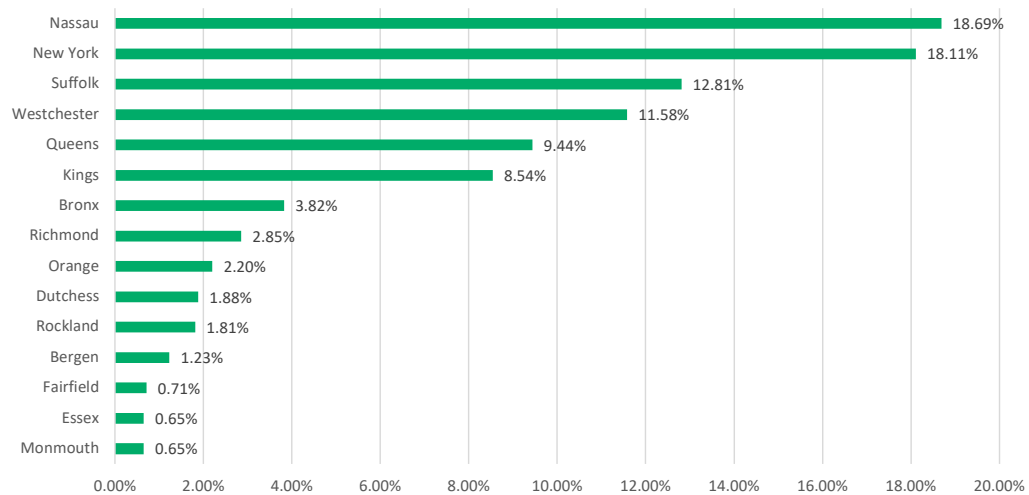
## Membership by Title

## 2022 AWARD OF DISTINCTION



**Michael J. Fosina, MPH, FACHE,**  
*Immediate Past Chair of the American College of Healthcare Executives;  
Retired President of NewYork-Presbyterian Lawrence Hospital; and  
Senior Vice President of NewYork-Presbyterian*

Mr. Fosina is a seasoned healthcare executive with over 30 years' experience at NewYork-Presbyterian. He also served as the 2020 Chairman of the Board for the American College of Healthcare Executives (ACHE) and Board Officer from 2019 to 2021. Mr. Fosina has been published and has spoken nationally and internationally. He has led both his hospital and ACHE during the global COVID pandemic. He is a recipient of numerous awards in both the community and the hospital community. Mr. Fosina received the highest honor bestowed to a healthcare executive for outstanding leadership as he was named the 2022 Gold Medal Award winner by ACHE. For the past three years (2019, 2020, 2021) he has been named one of the 100 most influential people in Westchester County.

In March of 2020, Mr. Fosina led NYP/Lawrence Hospital through the global COVID pandemic, as his hospital had one of the first known hospitalized COVID positive patients. During the same time, as the 2020 Chairman of the Board of Governors for ACHE, he led the organization through those unprecedented times, rapidly and radically transforming ACHE to meet the new needs of its healthcare members. With only three weeks between one of the first admitted COVID patients and the ACHE annual conference, under his leadership the Board made the decision to cancel the conference for the first time in 69 years. The organizational changes at ACHE during 2020 led to the new virtual conference format in 2021 having the highest attendance ever.

Mr. Fosina was president of NewYork-Presbyterian Lawrence Hospital, Bronxville, N.Y., and senior vice president of NewYork-Presbyterian, New York, from 2015 to 2022. Prior to that, he served as senior vice president and COO of NewYork-Presbyterian Lower Manhattan Hospital from 2013 to 2015; vice president and executive director of NewYork-Presbyterian Allen Hospital from 2000 to 2013; and director of integration and accreditation from 1998 to March 2000 for the newly merged NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital.

From 1990 to 1998, Mr. Fosina served at the former The New York Hospital—Cornell Medical Center in New York in roles of increasing scope and responsibility. From 1985 to 1990, he worked at the former Columbia Presbyterian Medical Center in New York.

In addition, Mr. Fosina serves as an advisory board member for the University of Delaware, College of Health Sciences; a board member for LiveOn NY (Council of Senior Centers) and the Business Council of Westchester. He also is an active Fellow in the New York Academy of Medicine, and was an adjunct professor at Columbia University's Mailman Graduate School of Public Health. He was a Congressional Fellow from 2011 to 2012 and a Health and Aging Policy Fellow from 2011 to 2013.

Mr. Fosina received his master's degree from Columbia University Mailman School of Public Health, and a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Delaware.

Michael is the son of Joe and Mickie Fosina, one of six children and a fourth generation New Rochellean. He continues to reside in New Rochelle with his wife Linda and their three children.

# ACHE RECOGNITION PROGRAM

The American College of Healthcare Executives (ACHE) Recognition Program celebrates affiliates' commitment to the healthcare management profession. Recognition is bestowed at three levels based on a range of specific volunteer activities that demonstrate leadership and contributions to furthering professional excellence. All active ACHE affiliates are eligible to be recognized.

The ACHE Recognition Program is based on points accrued through volunteer activities performed in a convocation year (April–March). Points begin to accrue for affiliates beginning with the 2003–2004 convocation year and are cumulative from year to year. An affiliate does not need to achieve a set number of points in a single year, but rather points will build over time. In that manner, affiliates have the opportunity to progress through the three award levels.

## The three award levels are:

- **Exemplary Service Award** = 125 points
- **Distinguished Service Award** = 75 points
- **Service Award** = 30 points

Of the 1,800+ HLNy members, 76 members received 1-star/Service award, 19 members received 2-stars, Distinguished award and 5 members received 3-stars/Exemplary Service award.

# SENIOR LEVEL HEALTHCARE EXECUTIVE AWARD



## **Dona Green, MA, MBA**

*Senior VP, Strategic Planning & Major Capital  
Project Management  
One Brooklyn Health*

Dona A. Green is the One Brooklyn Health inaugural senior vice president for Strategic Planning and system lead responsible for program management of OBH's \$664 million Kings County Transformation Program capital grant award from NYS Department of Health and the Dormitory Authority of the State of NY. The award was New York State's largest capital grant to a single health care system. Ms. Green's "third hat" is to serve as facilitator of a small, independent team of grant writers and developers leading a handful of talented grant writers who collectively generate roughly \$2 - \$4 million annually to improve the environment of care and care delivery for OBH's patients and staff in grant funding from public and private sources.

More than anything, Ms. Green keeps her eyes on the prize which is equity for the communities she serves, and her actions remain consistent with a popular Mahatma Gandhi quote, "The future depends on what we do in the present." Ms. Green is apt at these actions from a position of great depth after almost 30 years in the largest public health care system in the country, NYC Health + Hospitals in roles ranging from Director of Certificate of Need Development, Program lead for a post-acute based \$75 million revenue-generating initiative and Interim CEO of Queens Hospital Center leading her team through the first Epic install for the system, increase in Leapfrog score from a C to an A and securing more than \$35 million in private capital funding for the hospital.

Notable achievements include:

- Membership invitation to participate as a lay safety net hospital leader on the NYC Department of Buildings-led Hospital Working Group on climate change with a goal of greater electrification and carbon reduction
- Collaborated with OBH Board Members to finalize system Vision Statement
- Managing over 100 capital projects funded via the Kings County Transformation Grant and resuming regulatory compliance as projects completed
- Conducting focus groups with existing and prospective patients around specific capital projects to guard against complacency in designing spaces that the community served will occupy for years to come

## **Debra Pantin, MSW, MS**

*President and CEO  
Outreach*

Debra Pantin joined Outreach in July 2018 as President and CEO – the second person to hold that position in the agency's 39-year history. The industry veteran possesses more than 30 years of experience in the substance use and mental health treatment, housing and homeless, and healthcare fields. Her exceptional background ranks Pantin among New York City's top nonprofit professionals today.

Pantin began her career as a social worker and rose through the ranks to executive-level positions. Leveraging her leadership skills, she instituted and managed organizational changes that redefined agencies. She strategically expanded service portfolios, adding substance use treatment facilities (residential, outpatient, ambulatory detoxification and mental health) and a multitude of housing and special projects.

Previously, Pantin was the CEO of VIP Community Services, a Bronx-based social services organization offering housing/shelter, outpatient counseling, medical and mental health services to approximately 15,000 clients. While there, she successfully integrated healthcare into the agency's continuum of care and supported VIP's efforts to successfully gain a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) designation. During her tenure, VIP opened a mental health clinic, added care coordination services and brought ambulatory detox to its OASAS-funded outpatient clinic. The agency experienced unprecedented growth during her tenure with annual operations nearly doubling from \$21 million to \$39 million.

Pantin formerly served as Chief Operating Officer at Palladia Inc. (formerly Project Return). She directed operations and programs that annually served 26,000 clients with a budget of \$50 million. As a key member of the leadership team, Pantin influenced programmatic and organizational change such as the launch of three outpatient programs in the Bronx and Manhattan. She also established a CQI (Continuous Quality Improvement) intervention for the agency's community-based mental health services. Additionally, Pantin championed the adoption of NIATx (Network for the Improvement of Addiction Services) process as well as data-driven management to measure program performance. Pantin spent 25 years at the agency, working in a range of social work, clinical, program administration and executive positions.

Currently, Pantin is President of the Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Providers of New York State (ASAPNYS) and is the Chair of Mental Health News Education's Board of Directors. She participates in numerous national, state and local boards, and was previously the Co-Chair of the Substance Abuse Treatment Committee for the Coalition of Behavioral Health Agencies. VillageCare is a community-based, non-profit organization that offers managed care as well as post-acute and community-based programs. VillageCareMAX is one of the largest and fastest growing Plans in New York City.

Ms. DeVito's health care career – with a concentration in finance, management and strategic planning – spans more than 25 years. Ms. DeVito was extremely involved in VillageCare's reconfiguration and reform of its long-term and chronic care services, shifting the emphasis from institutional care to community-based services. Her expertise and insight was essential to program expansion and new ventures. Ms. DeVito serves on the boards of directors for: Greater New York Hospital Association (GNYHA) Vice-Chair Long Term Care; AmidaCare Board Member (a Medicaid managed care plan for persons living with HIV/AIDS); ACAP Board; Brooklyn Health Home Board; LeadingAge New York/Past Chair representing NY State; and LeadingAge National Audit Committee Chair.

In 2019, Ms. DeVito was appointed by New York State Governor Cuomo as a member of the Medicaid Redesign Team II (MRT II).
